



## **LEADERSHIP PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

### **MISSION STATEMENT:**

The National Society of Leadership and Success: A Community of Leaders

The National Society of Leadership and Success was founded to help individuals discover and achieve their aspirations by supplying the nation's leading presenters to colleges via live interactive broadcast, and by helping students create a community where motivated goal oriented individuals help each other to succeed. Our core philosophy is that students can achieve their desired professional and personal goals with proper support, and guided, directed, dedicated action.

The program includes two main components: The Speaker Series and Student Membership.

### **1. SPEAKER SERIES:**

The Society hosts six live videoconferences during the academic year. These interactive presentations give students the opportunity to hear some of the nation's top presenters, authors and business leaders discuss topics related to leadership, creating a vision, identifying goals, and successfully transitioning from college to career.

Past speakers have included Patch Adams, Jack Canfield, Bertice Berry, Stephen Covey, Joe Martin and Goldie Hawn. In addition to the live videoconferences, campuses can elect to receive the presentations on DVD. This gives schools the ability to show the presentation at their convenience and schedule additional viewings if needed.

### **2. STUDENT MEMBERSHIP:**

In addition to having the opportunity to hear some of the nation's leading presenters, authors, and success coaches, students who become members of the Society become a part of a community of likeminded, goal-oriented individuals. Students are placed into teams where fellow students share challenges, goals and aspirations, make commitments to each other, and hold each other accountable for their actions.

Members of the Society have the opportunity to use what they learn during the presentations from the speaker series in their personal lives. By surrounding themselves with likeminded individuals, students are exposed to peer mentoring, which often leads to improved communications, increased confidence in team participation, and better organizational and planning skills.

Similar to other honor societies, students receive an invitation from you in the mail informing them the program exists on campus and inviting them to participate. The Society's National Office manages the process of generating interest for schools by sending invitations and covering all mail expenses.



### **INTERNSHIP COMPENSATION CHECKLIST**

This internship involves working with The National Society of Leadership and Success to establish a chapter on your campus. The National Office will supply you with the materials needed and walk you through the steps to make founding a chapter a reality. Intern may expect to dedicate an average of 7-10 hours per week.

The internship includes a training retreat. Travel expenses, meals (from arrival-departure from hotel), and hotel accommodations are all covered by Society.

Compensation will only be awarded to interns that send invitations and successfully establish a chapter on campus. A stipend check of \$1,500 is earned after successful completion of all steps below. Internship payment is processed after the National Office receives the End of Semester Report from the intern. Failure to complete all items below will result in a 10% reduction per incomplete step.

- Submit Internship Semester Calendar at least one month before Orientation
- Participate in all Intern Success Networking Team meetings assigned at retreat during internship semester
- Solidify advisor commitment and send invitations
- Recruit at least 4 executive board members before Orientation
- Recruit complete executive board of 10-12 members before Leadership Training Day
- Host at least two Orientation meetings (campuses with 200+ members must hold at least three)
- Host at least two Leadership Training Days (campuses with 200+ members must hold at least three)
- Assure all pending members are assigned to a Success Networking Team
- Show each Speaker Event from the current semester two or more times
- Host or co-host at least one community service event in the internship semester
- Secure \$700 toward National Dues by the end of the internship semester
- Attend all three Student President Conference Calls during the internship semester
- Complete the Second Semester Chapter Calendar by the end of the internship semester
- Participate in all weekly calls with Internship Coordinator throughout internship-*1<sup>st</sup> call missed will be a warning, any further misses will deduct 10% from the stipend per missed weekly call*
- Send in all weekly reports by deadline-*1<sup>st</sup> report late or missed will be a warning, any further misses will deduct 10% from the stipend per missed weekly report*

### **POTENTIAL BONUSES**

- Participate in 4/5 Success Networking Team meetings with group from retreat prior to Internship Semester - \$100
- Second semester invitation materials submitted to the National Office by end of first semester - \$100
